## TAPE SCRIPT

### Text and Phone Messages

#### (1) Ellie

Well, I spend about five pounds a week on my phone. I used to use it mainly for calling but now I use it mostly for texting. I always take it with me.

#### (2) Simon

I don't have a mobile phone but my mum and dad say that they might give me one for Christmas. They think phones are a good idea because they can get in touch with me wherever I am.

#### (3) Kate

My mum is cool about texting. She says that when she was a girl she and her friends used to pass each other notes on paper. They'd pass notes around in the classroom behind the teacher's back. She thinks texting is just a high-tech version of the same thing.

#### (5) Mr Harrison

I know some people worry that kids might not learn to spell words properly – that they'll use the short forms of words for text messages. But I don't. I think texting is great – they have to work out ways to write with fewer letters.
